WHAT IS THE YOUTH COMMISSION?

The purpose of the Youth Commission is to make young people part of the solution to tackling crime and improving policing, rather than being seen as part of the problem.

The Youth Commission consists of up to 50 members aged 14-25, from across Hampshire, Isle of Wight, Portsmouth and Southampton from a diverse range of different backgrounds, who provide opportunities for young people to inform, support and challenge the Police and Crime Commissioner's work.

The aims of the Youth Commission are:

- Influencing, and working with, the Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner
- Identifying three priority areas relating to young people around police and crime
- Consulting young people on our priorities through the 'Big Conversation'
- Linking with Hampshire Constabulary
- Attending events and tackling the three priorities by raising awareness
- Creating Campaigns
- Representing the Youth Commission at relevant events, conferences and meetings
- Sharing views with professionals by making recommendations for change and suggesting solutions
