What is a Hate Crime?

"A hate crime is any criminal offence which is perceived by the victim or any other person to be motivated by hostility or prejudice based on a personal characteristic".

The five personal characteristics included in this are:

- Race or ethnicity
- Religion or beliefs (this includes places of worship)
- Sexual orientation
- Disability (this includes those with learning disabilities and/or mental and emotional distress)
- (Trans) gender identity

A hate Crime or Hate incident can take many forms including:

- Physical Abuse
- Verbal abuse
- Written/printed abuse
- Harassment
- Threats
- Sexual abuse
- Indirect attacks
- Exclusion or isolation

Experiences of Young People



- These are some of the responses from the participants of our workshops/surveys:

"I have experienced homophobic and racist comments from family and other peers, sometimes unintentional - they aren't aware that their words are unkind"

"Since the referendum, racist actions and bigotry have been commonplace. At school racist terms and slurs have been common"

"As an ethnic minority and a foreign national, I am regularly subjected to racial comments, most out of ignorance but at times I have felt threatened"

"I have seen friends that are disabled who have been made fun of".

Solutions From Young People



"Better education about religion i.e. not all Muslims are terrorists"

"Increase punishment for hate crime and also teach people about it in schools, people learn about cyber bullying and the consequences but hardly ever about hate crime"

"Set up support anti-bullying/equality committees in schools, colleges and universities, make LGBTQ+, sex ed part of primary/ secondary school curriculum to normalise relationships"

"Create YouTube adverts about hate crime - a campaign".

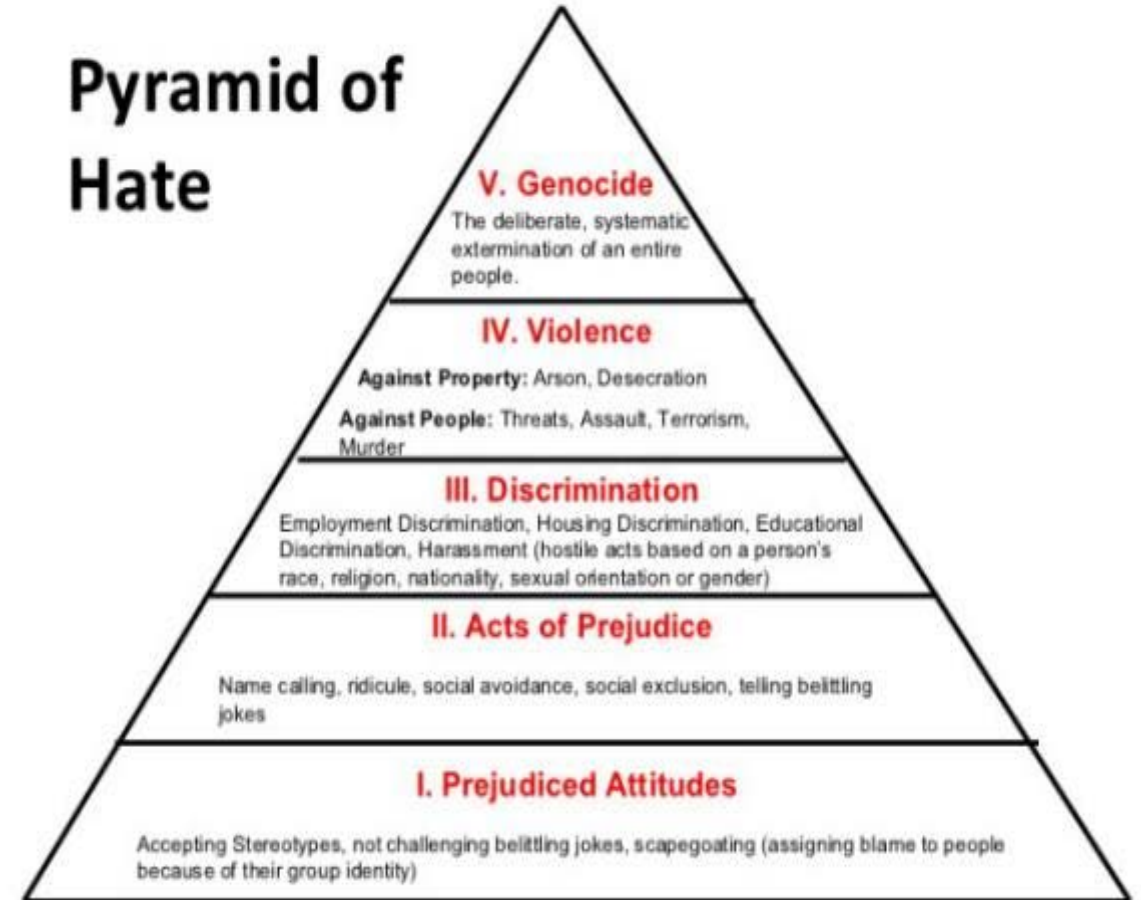

Prejudicial Language Meeting

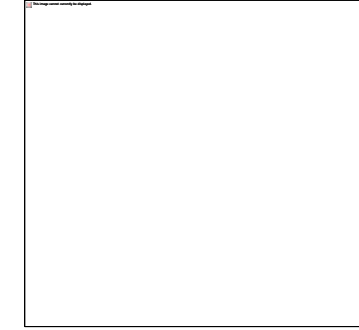


- Devising a new prejudicial language / behaviours (hate crime) reporting tool which can be used in schools

Youth Commission Recommendations



- Awareness - Facebook, Instagram, YouTube adverts to promote hate crime workshops, events etc
- Support - well advertised support system in schools, colleges + universities. Needs to be external support
- Education - what is a 'hate crime', how to report it etc
- Consequences - proactive long-term programmes for perpetrators to help get them back on track. Could involve engaging with victim
- Diversity Charter - education charter based on diversity
