### Your request under Freedom of Information Act (FOIA)

Thank you for contacting the office of the Police and Crime Commissioner for information about how many times the Police and Crime Commissioner has applied for a certificate of forfeiture for an officer's pension after they were convicted of a criminal offence. - 3. In cases where the certificate was not granted, please provide details ie sentence not seemed serious enough.*
