## Your request under Freedom of Information Act (FOIA)

Thank you for contacting the Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner requesting information about printers. Your request was dated 8th March 2023 has been given the reference HA3148.

You have requested the following information:

" I am making the following Freedom of Information Request to gather the relevant data.

- 1. How many employees do you have?
- 2. How many printers (A4, A3 single function or multi-function) do you have?
- 3. How many print servers do you have?
- 4. Do you use any print management software (Equitrac, SafeQ, PaperCut, PrinterLogic etc)?
- 5. Who supplies your printers, software and servers?
- 6. If so, which do you use?
- 7. What is the job title of the person responsible for printers within your organization?"

## **Responses:**

How many employees do you have?	As of 31 <sup>st</sup> December 2022 the OPCC employes 45 individuals with an FTE of 44.3

How many printers (A4, A3 single function or multi-function) do you have?	1 multi-function printer
How many print servers do you have?	Print servers are provided by Hampshire Constabulary's Joint ICT department so this information is not held by the OPCC
Do you use any print management software (Equitrac, SafeQ, PaperCut, PrinterLogic etc)?	Printer software is provided by Hampshire Constabulary's Joint ICT department so this information is not held by the OPCC
Who supplies your printers, software and servers?	Printers are provided by Hampshire Constabulary's Joint ICT department so this information is not held by the OPCC
If so, which do you use?	Printers are provided by Hampshire Constabulary's Joint ICT department so this information is not held by the OPCC
What is the job title of the person responsible for printers within your organization?"	Printers are provided by Hampshire Constabulary's Joint ICT department further details will not be provided because it is exempt from disclosure due to section 40(2).  We are not obliged, under section 40(2) of the Act, to provide any information which is the personal information of another person, and whose release would contravene the provisions in the Data Protection Act 1998 (DPA).In this case the disclosure would breach the
	fairness principle of the Data Protection Act which means such disclosure would be unlawful.  The terms of this exemption in the Freedom of Information Act mean that

	we are not obliged to consider whether or not it would be in the public interest for you to have the information.
