Terry's professional background is in the education sector; until April 2022 he was a secondary school Drama and English teacher. During his teaching career he spent time in an educational leadership role setting ambitious goals delivering school change programmes (both locally and nationally) which benefitted young people by having access to a high-quality educational outcomes.

Terry served as an Elected Member of Portsmouth City Council before joining the OPCC. He was the opposition spokesman for the Children, Families and Education portfolio and a member of the Education Advisory, Children & Young People Board. Being a strong voice for the public demonstrates his commitment to public service.

Terry's responsibilities as Deputy Police and Crime Commissioner include supporting the Police & Crime Commissioner (PCC) with daily governance of Hampshire and Isle of Wight Constabulary as well as supporting the day to day executive leadership of the Office of Police and Crime Commissioner (OPCC). Terry chairs the Modern Day Slavery Board, he is the OPCC lead for the Force Performance Board, the Force Legitimacy Board, and the Out of Court Disposal Board. He also assists with casework and public meetings. Terry supports the monitoring of commissioned services, OPCC grants, specifically those linked to children and young people.

Many of Terry's daily meetings relate to the strategic management and development of Integrated Care Systems (ICs) and Community Safety Partnerships (CSPs) and the Youth Commission for which he is the lead on behalf of the PCC.
