Dear Parent/Carer

I am writing to you on behalf of the Violence Reduction Partnership about the national knife crime awareness campaign , Operation Sceptre, that is running from 13th – 19th May in England and Wales.

We believe it is important to educate and support young people to make good choices, and this will be a focus this week. Our aim is to educate children that they are safer not carrying knives, and to help them walk away from harm. To achieve this, we will engaging children in educational activities and awareness talks.

This is a difficult topic, but we know that talking about knives gives us a chance to tackle this issue. Maybe you could encourage your child to take the survey, via the QR code below.

Very few young people will ever carry knives, but when knife crime happens, it can have devastating impacts. We are working hard to drive down knife carrying. It is against the law to carry a knife for your protection. We are asking all parents and carers to talk to their children about this, understand their thoughts on this, and seek help if you are worried. Your child is very unlikely to ever carry a knife, but perhaps they know someone who might. Here are some useful resources:
